The Governance Futures Lab is a new initiative at the Institute for the Future that brings social inventors and futures thinking to the challenge of designing better systems of governance.

Today's governments are increasingly incapable of dealing effectively and justly with the complex global challenges of the 21st Century. Governance failures will not only cause suffering for today's citizens, but will ripple through time, constraining the future for generations to come. Revolutions have recently ruptured decades-old systems of government in the Arab world, and widespread dissatisfaction is growing in the United States and Europe, raising questions and demand for new thinking. If government as we've known it isn't working, what new forms of governance will we have and rely upon to reconstitute society?

The answer to this question may not be discovered, it may have to be invented. The aim of the Governance Futures Lab is to reimagine and experiment with the basic architectures and processes of governance. We believe it necessary to prototype better systems to govern life on our planet. We now have powerful tools to connect, organize, and coordinate human behavior. We also have an unprecedented amount of knowledge about how the world works and humanity's role in its own future.



## **Upcoming Event:** ReConstitutional Convention

On April 26–27, 2013 IFTF's Governance Futures Lab will hold a ReConstitutional Convention, a two-day gathering to imagine and design better systems of governance.

This ReConstitutional Convention will help create both a community of social inventors and a common language around governance design. The Convention will generate new concepts and connections that will guide the future activities of the Lab and its network.

IFTF will set the context for the main governance challenges of the Anthropocene—the current age of planetary challenges and human responsibility. On day one, we'll hear from innovators leading experiments in governance and social organization, who will create "design briefs" that will provide the foundation for new ways of constituting society. Informed by these insights, on day two we will host a public prototyping workshop that invites the global community to creatively model new forms of governance for the future.
